MATERIALS (*New Students pls check the class is running before purchasing materials.*)

OIL COLOURS: **White** (Titanium) 150ml

Yellow (Mid and Lemon)

Red (Light and Crimson)

Blue (Ultramarine and Pthalo)

Burnt Sienna

Yellow Ochre

Viridian Green

Black

40 ml size tubes. Suggested brands: AS, Winton, Georgian, Art Prism, Reeves, W&N....

BRUSHES: Stiff Synthetic - Filbert shaped. Sizes –1, 2, 6, 8, and 12.

PALETTE: A3 size palette or 30 x 40cm white rectangle or kidney-shaped wood.

PAINTING KNIFE: Diamond shaped size 100/110.

ODOURLESS SOLVENT: 500ml.

RAG: soft cloth

WILLOW CHARCOAL: Two thin sticks.

PAINTING SUPPORTS: Canvas boards, stretched canvas, oil sketch paper, primed panel.

YOU WILL NEED SOMETHING TO PAINT ON FOR WEEK 1 –

30 x 40 cm canvas board or stretched canvas. Best price at \$2 shops, Officeworks, Kmart, Bunnings, Lincraft, Spotlight (these shops also have good inexpensive brushes).

Try and buy a beginners (student quality: Winton, Georgian, AS) set of oils so you don't pay too much. Oil colours are priced according to their Series Numbers, so try and buy only **Series 1** student quality paints. Different brands can be intermixed so you don't have to stick to one name.

Likewise with brushes - Art Basics are less expensive than Neef.

The Art Scene at West Ryde is your best priced shop. But there is Eckersleys on the North Shore. Also we can't use turpentine in a public studio so Odourless Solvent is essential.

If in any doubt wait and speak to me in class. I have some colours you can start with but you will need a surface to paint on - 30 x 40cm (approximately) canvas board, canvas paper, or stretched canvas (best purchased at a \$2 shop).
